#### **Conference Overview and Introduction**

Mary Magdalene is a mystery, in a real and theological sense. A mystery, in its basic definition, is that which is unknown and secret. In theology, a mystery is an aspect of revelation that remains beyond our full comprehension, while at the same time we partly grasp it in faith. More than grasping a mystery with our intellect, we can enter into its dynamic. The mystery of Jesus' sacrificial death, for example, is beyond our human capacity to grasp in all its significance and greatness. Nonetheless, in our personal suffering or in prayer, we touch the mystery and unite to the suffering of Jesus, allowing it to bear fruit in our spiritual journey, as his suffering bore fruit for the redemption of humanity.

Mary Magdalene's person and life represent a mystery. The details elude us. But the essential message of her life-project shines out for all to admire. She exemplifies the drama of redemption at work within every human person. She embodies the dynamics of the Christian life in its fullness, from sinner to seeker, from curious follower to committed disciple. Reflecting on the mystery of her person we find encouragement for our journey.

Despite the fact that the totality of her figure is "veiled," a glimpse into her person reveals essential universal messages with which all can identify: the deep need to experience unconditional love and acceptance, the desire to be set free of the toil and turmoil of life's

demands, the joy of encountering the Lord, the fortitude experienced when God's grace and the Holy Spirit take over, and the hope that Jesus offers us throughout our lives.

I would like to "unveil" some of the mystery surrounding the person of Mary Magdalene by sharing insights gained through study, reflection, and prayer on the archaeology, geography, and history of ancient Magdala, as well as the scriptural passages and historical traditions prevalent through the centuries. We will also reflect on the dynamic of her encounter with Jesus, her response to the call to discipleship and her maturity in freedom and love, hoping that it can serve as reflection for your personal journey with the Lord.

#### **Presentation 1**

#### Mary Magdalene's Hometown: A Virtual Tour through Ancient Magdala

This conference gives context to the town in which Mary Magdalene lived allowing us to enter into the gospel context of Mary's life and possible movements in her soul that brought her into contact with Jesus and to the point of conversion. This tour will "paint the town" for our imagination through a presentation of the archaeology, history and geography surrounding first century Magdala.

#### **Presentation 2**


#### The Life Drama of Mary Magdalene: Insights from Sacred Scripture
